Current form:

"ARTICLE 5: REPRESENTATIVE TO THE MANAGEMENT BOARD OF EUROPOL

The JPSG shall appoint, from its full Members, a representative who will be entitled to attend, in accordance with Article 14 of the Europol Regulation and for a duration determined by the JPSG, meetings of the Management Board of Europol as a non-voting observer. The representative shall report back to the JPSG after each meeting of the Management Board on his/her main findings in writing. "


Proposed modifications:

1. The following new sentence will be inserted as the second sentence: "The representative shall, in principle, be a member of the delegation of the current Presidency Parliament.".

Proposed form:

ARTICLE 4: PROCEEDINGS AND LANGUAGES

4.2. Right to ask questions

Current form:

"4.2. Right to ask questions

Members of the JPSG may address both oral and written questions to Europol. Written questions may also be asked outside the meeting framework and independently of items listed on the agenda and shall be answered within an appropriate timeframe. The questions shall reflect the mandate of the JPSG as defined in Regulation (EU) 2016/794 (Europol Regulation). These questions shall be relayed to Europol after their admissibility has been checked by the Co-Chairs and the question is deemed to be in line with the Europol regulation. A further written reply can be requested in case the answer to an oral question is deemed insufficient. "

Proposed modifications:

- 1. The phrase "an appropriate timeframe" is to be replaced by "a six-week timeframe";
- 2. The admissibility of the questions shall be checked by the Troika instead of the Co-Chairs;
- 3. The following new sentence will be inserted as the third sentence: "The admitted questions, as well as the answers provided by Europol, shall be submitted to all delegations and, unless subject to confidentiality restrictions, published on IPEX".

Proposed form:

"4.2. Right to ask questions

Members of the JPSG may address both oral and written questions to Europol. Written questions may also be asked outside the meeting framework and independently of items listed on the agenda and shall be answered within a six-week timeframe. Questions shall reflect the mandate of the JPSG, as defined in Regulation (EU) 2016/794 (Europol Regulation) and be sent to the Presidential Troika to check their admissibility and relay them to Europol. The admitted questions, as well as the answers provided by Europol, shall be submitted to all delegations and, unless subject to confidentiality restrictions, published on IPEX. Further written replies can be requested in case answers are deemed insufficient."
